UM Digital Initiatives



- Digital initiatives going back to 1980s
- UMLibText 1989

- Humanities Text Initiative 1994
- PEAK, JSTOR, Making of America





UM Digital Initiatives (2)


- Digital Library Production Service(DLPS) 1996
- Base funding
- Focus: long term access + preservation

UM Digital Collections Online

- Text, images, numeric spatial data, finding aids, bibliographic/reference collections
- Pre-Google:
 - 141 Text Collections
 - 25 million page images
 - 3 million pages of encoded text
 - 89 Image Collections
 - 200,000 images

Google/UM Partnership

- Announced in December 2004
- 7 million University Library volumes
- Digitize and make searchable via Google search engine
- UM gets its own copy
- Google covers most costs ©

University Library mission statement:

"To support, enhance, and collaborate in the instructional, research, and service activities of faculty, students, and staff, and contribute to the common good by collecting, organizing, preserving, communicating, and sharing the record of human knowledge."

Digitization Begins

- Google began image capture at UM in July 2004
- Getting books out and back developed workflows – back on the shelf within 5–7 days
- Developed mechanisms for receiving content from Google

Scary Workflow Diagram




Image Quality

- Library Preservation Standards
- 600 dpi TIFFs; 300 dpi JP2K
- Automatic validation of files upon ingest
- Manual Quality Review and Feedback

Google Rejects

- Files not scanned by Google
- Rejected due to poor condition
- Digitize ourselves separate workflow







Access





- September 2006 UM released local implementation – MBooks
- System for accessing our digital collections
- Access through MIRLYN UM Library OPAC
- Created Rights Database to manage access



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

field of theological and political speculation, it is easy today to select, among the writings of the earliest colonists, certain radical utterances which seem to presage the very temper of the late eighteenth century. Pastor John Robinson's farewell address to the Pilgrims at Leyden in 1620 contained the famous words: "The Lord has more truth yet to break forth out of His holy Word. I cannot sufficiently bewail the condition of the reformed churches, who are come to a period in religion. . . . Luther and Calvin were great and shining lights in their times, yet they penetrated not into the whole counsel of God." Now John Robinson, like Oliver Cromwell, never set foot on American soil, but he is identified, none the less, with the spirit of American liberalism in religion.

In political discussion, the early emergence of that type of independence familiar to the decade 1765-75 is equally striking. In a letter written in 1818, John Adams insisted that "the principles and feelings which produced the Revolution ought to be traced back for two hundred years, and sought in the history of the country from the fact plantations in America" "I have always



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


